April 1, 2009

Trip to Braine l'Alleud for a visit of the Panorama of the Battle of Waterloo (First Panorama on a tentative list for UNESCO-World Heritage) and visits to the remaining panorama buildings in Brussels:

- Av. Maurice Lemonnier: Panorama rotunda transferred into a parking garage
- Japanese Tower: former part of the "Panorama du Tour du Monde" by Louis Dumoulin (cfr. Waterloo) located in Paris (World fair Exhibition 1900) and rebuild in Brussels by Léopold II.
- Parc du Cinquantenaire: Panorama rotunda transferred into a Mosque. The building has been constructed in 1880 by Ernest van Humbeek in an arabesque style to house the Panorama of Cairo (1880-81) painted by Emile Charles Wauters (1846-1933). The building has been restored in 1978 and transferred into the 'Grande Mosque' by architect Boubaker from Tunesia with funds from Saudi Arabia
